## Soap Sock Pattern

These make great gifts and are a great stash buster.

When complete the sock is quite stretchy and fits a large variety of soaps including most square homemade bars from markets and the like.

Written in UK terminology.

Worked in continuous rounds.

One sock Measures approx 7.5cm by 10cm, not including the handle loop.

Pattern starts at the bottom of the sock and works up to make a loop handle and a little hole for the handle to go through to hold the sock closed.

Gauge is not important for this project.

Normally I use Bendigo Woollen Mills 8ply Cotton but you could use a cotton blend, this may cause a variation in the size of the sock a little.

## Materials and Tools Required for Project:

6.5mm Crochet Hook

Stitch marker

12gm (or 25-30m) of Bendigo Woollen Mills 8Ply Cotton (any colour or colours)

Yarn Needle

Scissors

## Abbreviations and Special Stitches:

St - Stitch

Ch - Chain

DC - Double Crochet

SLST - Slip Stitch



## Soap Sock Pattern

1 Chain 12 st

2 Dc in 2<sup>nd</sup> ch from hook,

Dc in next 9st, 3dc in the last st,

Turn piece around to work down the other side of ch st's,

Dc in next 9st, 2dc in the last chain.

I like to place my st marker on the last st of each row but place it where ever you need to so you know where

the beginning and end of each row is.

24sts

3 - 17 Dc in each st around.

Dc in next 11 st, Ch 30 (reasonably tight so make a strong

handle), dc in same st as bengining of ch,

Dc in next 10 st, ch2, skip 2 st, dc in last st of row.

Dc in next 4 st, slst into next and fasten off and sew in

ends.
